# Did You Know?

Being in the Park Avenue Historic District Makes You Eligible for Tax Credits

The new sign in Morrison Park celebrates our neighborhood being part of the officially-designated Park Avenue Historic District. This district received formal approval in February 2020 to be placed on the National Register of Historic Districts. The designation is more than an honor.

Do you know that you are now eligible to apply to the NYS Homeownership Rehabilitation Tax Credit Program? Administered by the NY State Historic Preservation Office, this program provides a credit off your NYS income tax that can help offset repairs and upgrades to your home.


Go to our website at www.abcstreets.org and click on "Resources" to find out more about getting a credit off your NYS income tax, worth 20% of qualifying repair and rehab expenses, up to a credit value of \$50,000 per year. The value of the credit can be applied to your state tax liability and reduce the amount you owe.

You can also contact our area representative, Christina Vagvolgyi at the NYS Historic Preservation Office (Christina.Vagvolgyi@parks.ny.gov) if you are considering any work on your home. It is important to remember that tax credits are not retroactive. You cannot apply for any work that has already been started.

You may also contact the Landmark Society, which has recently begun offering services to homeowners wherein they can hire Landmark Society staff to help them complete the tax credit application. Those interested in this service should contact:

#### Cobbs Hill Village Decision Due Soon

In September, five judges on the state appellate court heard legal arguments for preserving the affordable senior housing at Cobbs Hill Village and protecting the historic park. A decision in the case, which involves two lawsuits heard by the court at the same time, is expected later this year.

The ABC Streets Neighborhood Association is one of 37 neighborhood associations and community groups across the city that have, along with hundreds of concerned citizens, pursued questioning legal and administrative processes for a controversial development

narrowly approved in a 5-4 City Council vote in 2018. The alliance includes the Cobbs Hill Tenants Association. The existing Cobbs Hill Village has 60 studio and one-bedroom units for seniors with limited incomes. Plans by Rochester Management, Inc., call for a 104-unit mix of studio, one and twobedroom apartments and townhomes.

"Our hopes are that Cobbs Hill Village remains an *affordable* home for seniors and our park remains undisturbed," said Tom Pastecki, ABC Neighborhood Association president.

### Can You Help?

The cost of printing documents for the court case heard in September is more than the Cobbs Hill Village Tenants Association can afford to pay in the effort to protect their homes. Additional petitioners in the suit are seeking donations to fund the deficit. Election Day is drawing closer and it's important to take time to plan how you will vote. Your Options Are:

#### IN PERSON:

- Tuesday, November 3. Our area's voting location is the **Rochester Academy of Medicine**, 1441 East Avenue. **Polls Open: 6:00 a.m.-9:00 p.m.**
- Saturday, October 24-Sunday, November 1. You can vote at any Early Voting site (see <a href="https://www.monroecounty.gov/elections">www.monroecounty.gov/elections</a> for locations).

#### ABSENTEE:

- If you've already mailed your ballot, check www.monroecounty.gov/elections to see if it's been received.
- If you need an absentee ballot, you can get one until November 2 by going to the Board of Elections at 39 West Main Street. The office is open Monday through Friday (9:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m.).
- Absentee ballots can be dropped off at the Board of Elections, any Early Voting Site or at any Election Day Polling Place in the county (as an alternative to mailing).
- If you choose to mail your ballot, the USPS recommends it be mailed at least seven days prior to November 3. Mailed ballots must be postmarked by November 3.
- Absentee ballots may be dropped off by someone other than the voter.
